What is it and who can participate?

The State Games of America is an Olympic-style event featuring competition between State Games medal winners (gold, silver, bronze) from across the nation. There are currently 35 states conducting or organizing statewide sports festivals known as State Games.

When is the event held?

The event is hosted every two years on the odd year (i.e. 2017, 2019, etc.).

Virginia Amateur Sports, the City of Lynchburg, Liberty University and the Virginia Commonwealth Games at Liberty University will host the State Games of America. The 2019 State Games of America in Lynchburg is expected to attract 14,000 competitors. Most recently, the largest State Games of America was held in Lincoln, NE with over 15,000 total participants.
