2022 VA Commonwealth Games Announces Plans

Virginia Amateur Sports (VAS) announced today some exciting news for the 2022 Virginia Commonwealth Games, including a fun change to the beloved Opening Ceremony.

The Tailgate Party and Opening Ceremonies are each getting a remix for 2022. The Parade of Athletes will kick off at 5:30pm, leading into Opening Ceremonies, which will feature the newly crowned Miss VA Victoria Chuah, the Lighting the cauldron and the official kicking off the Games - while also highlighting the 50th Anniversary of the passage of the Title IX legislation. The Tailgate party will begin at 6pm following the conclusion of the Opening Ceremonies - athletes will receive their complimentary food with their Games wristband, as well as some extra goodies. There will be lots of games, activities and so much more! All of the festivities will take place from 5:30-8pm on Friday, July 22nd in the LU Indoor Football Practice Facility. Both events Friday evening are free to the public and open to the community.

There are 5 new sports and 1 returning sport this year – Cheerleading, Gravel Racing, Adaptive Rugby, Inclusive Track & Field, Team Volleyball, and the return of Mountain Biking. We have held a few competitions already this year – Adaptive Rugby (April), part of Baseball, Figure Skating, Swimming, Triathlon and Wrestling were all held in June. To date over 2,500 athletes have competed in the Games in 2022. We were excited to add Adaptive Rugby and Inclusive Track & Field to give even more of Virginia's athletes, that hadn't previously been able to compete, the opportunity to show their skills and earn a medal. Again this year, we will have Live Streaming of the All Star Baseball Tournament games (provided by Liberty University). The All Star Baseball Tournament starts this weekend – July 15-17, and the link for viewing those Games, as well as the team rosters are on our website.

There are 5 events kicking off this weekend – Snowflex (Liberty University), Adult Softball (Peaksview Park), Pickleball (Liberty University), Racquetball (Liberty University), and All Star Baseball (Liberty University). Main Games weekend (July 22-24) will bring 12 sports to Lynchburg and the surrounding area, 1 in Roanoke, 1 in Christiansburg and Chess is virtual – for a total of 15 sports in 3 days. It is sure to be a great weekend of competition and performances, including over 100 basketball teams.

Liberty University President Prevo said "Liberty University is proud to continue its partnership with Virginia Amateur Sports as we host the 2022 Virginia Commonwealth Games here on campus. We look forward to welcoming the athletes and their families to Lynchburg as these talented athletes exhibit their skills and determination during this week's competitions."
