VA Commonwealth Games Announces Plans

Virginia Amateur Sports (VAS) announced today some exciting news for the 2025 Virginia Commonwealth Games and beyond. We have held a few competitions already this year – Able 3 on 3 Wheelchair Basketball, Archery, part of Baseball, Croquet, 5K Run, part of Basketball Skills Challenge, Swimming, and Triathlon were all held in March, May, June, and early July. To date, over 2,500 athletes have competed in the Games in 2025.

There are 5 events kicking off this weekend – Able Baseball, Adult Softball (Peaksview Park), Pickleball (Virginia Beach), Racquetball (Liberty University), and All-Star Baseball (Liberty University). Again, this year, we will have Live Streaming of the All-Star Baseball Tournament medal games (provided by Liberty University). The link for viewing the All-Star Baseball Games, as well as the team rosters, are on our website.

Main Games weekend (July 16-20) will bring 12 sports to Lynchburg and the surrounding area and 1 virtual event – Shooting – for a total of 13 sports in 5 days. It is sure to be a great weekend of competition and performances, including over 110 basketball teams.

The Parade of Athletes will kick off at 5:30 pm, leading into Opening Ceremonies, which will feature the newly crowned Miss VA, the Lighting of the Cauldron, and the official kicking off of the Games. The OrthoVirginia Tailgate Party will begin at 6 pm following the conclusion of the Opening Ceremonies - athletes will receive their complimentary food with their Games wristband. There will be lots of games, activities, and so much more! All of the festivities will take place from 5:30-8 pm on Friday, July 18th, in the LU Indoor Football Practice Facility. Both events on Friday evening are free to the public and open to the community. There will be food available for the public and non-athletes to purchase, as well.

In 2025, the Virginia Commonwealth Games - Able Games will be composed of 6 different events: baseball, bowling, fishing, soccer, wheelchair basketball, and track & field. The goal is to add more opportunities each year for these amazing athletes. We look forward to the future of the Able Games.

We are also excited to announce our new host community for the 2026-2028 VA Commonwealth Games – The Richmond Region. After numerous conversations and evaluations, the presentation featuring the Capital of the Commonwealth was the best fit for the future of the Games.
